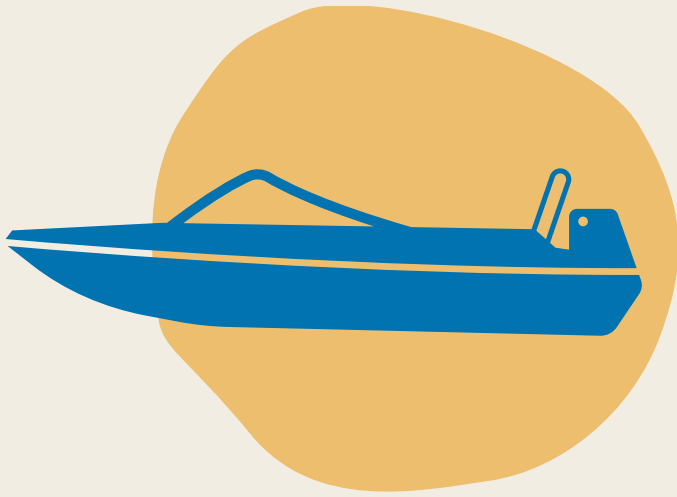




The Biggest Mistakes First Time Boat Buyers Make According to Us
